

Notice of Final Agency Action

RE: Regulations Concerning Early Intervention Services for Infants and Toddlers and Their Families (aka "Birth to Three") Sections 17a-248-1 to 17a-248-14, inclusive of the Regulations of Connecticut State Agencies

The Commissioner of Developmental Services hereby provides Notice of Final Agency Action on regulations concerning **Early Intervention Services for Infants and Toddlers and Their Families** (aka "Birth to Three").

Notice of Intent to Amend the Early Intervention Services for Infants and Toddlers and Their Families Regulations was published on the Secretary of the State's website on February 7, 2014. Two public hearings to receive testimony concerning the proposed amendments to the regulations were convened on March 10, 2014 at 9:00 a.m. and 5:00 p.m. in Conference Room A, Department of Developmental Services, 460 Capitol Avenue, Hartford, CT. In addition, written comments were received and considered by the department through April 8, 2014. The Department of Developmental Services (DDS) received no public comments on the amendments to these regulations and plans no changes to the proposed, amended regulations for Birth to Three services.

PUBLIC HEARING TESTIMONY AND COMMENT SUMMARY

The Department of Developmental Services received no comments from the public on the amended Early Intervention Services for Infants and Toddlers and Their Families regulations. No one from the public attended either of the two public hearings held on March 10, 2014.
